3. CUSU AFFILIATION

- Gavin visited Laura & Ms. Miles. Votes on CUSU council retained despite disaffiliation.
- University may make College pay fees rather than TCSU – retaining subscription fee still seems improbable.
- Rumour that other JCR presidents wish to pass constitutional amendment to withdraw CUSU services from Trinity students, but quorum unlikely to be reached due to necessity of University-wide referendum.
- CUSU keen to gain support in Trinity. Open meeting in first few weeks of May.

4. CUSU COUNCIL

- Proposal to change LGB women's rep to LGBT women's rep.
- Milena to be absent on wednesday – Tom Coker to replace?

5. LIAISON COMMITTEE – MATTERS ARISING

- Accommodation strategy proposed by Junior Bursar.
- Bicycle parking – Nevile’s gate opening hours to be amended for experimental period to reduce bicycle thefts.
- Dean’s limit on parties announced as 19th May- 23rd June.
- Kosher food – catering is unwilling to agree to anything that cannot be verified. Mr. Green’s proposal to be investigated.
- Room balloting – no complaints received by Tim but will still rewrite Phil’s proposal. Also religious requirements to be investigated by Equal Opportunities committee. Proposal to be written and submitted ahead of time of submitting requirements ahead of publication of ballot.
- Screens in the bar – Mr. Reinhardt’s quote is £11,500. To be considered further by Gavin. Capacity for flexible weekend opening of bar at lunchtime, investigation by Karaan. Discussion over change in function of bar.
- Histon Road – waiving of vacation charges is primary objective. Levy and rebate appear out of reach.
