1. GLOW! WPR

(i) Early Ending

At 12:30am, someone set off a dry powder fire extinguisher in A kitchen above the WPR. This set off an alarm and four fire engines were sent. Eight fire men in full breathing apparatus had to come. Occupants of the Wolfson had to stay in Chapel until 2:30am.

(ii) New Soundsystem

Georgia asked if we could get a new sound system for the WPR. The DJs couldn't mix and the sound quality was poor. We will have to get a new sound system

eventually, so even if we don't have the money now we should get a loan from the Junior Bursar.

(iii) Capacity

The porters at one point claimed that there were 130 people in the WPR, but this was unlikely to be more than a guesstimate. (iv) Shots Bar

The shots bar was a good addition but it only took a quarter as much money as the main bar. Shots cost 17p yet sell for a pound. We should push the shots bar more, because people didn't know where it was – e.g. bringing shots on trays to sell to people at the beginning.

(v) Pole

Joe told us why the Welfare Committee were unanimously against having a pole in the WPR. There were health and safety worries – e.g. someone using the pole upside down and landing on their face. There was a worry that it would encourage drunk people to do things that they would later regret.
